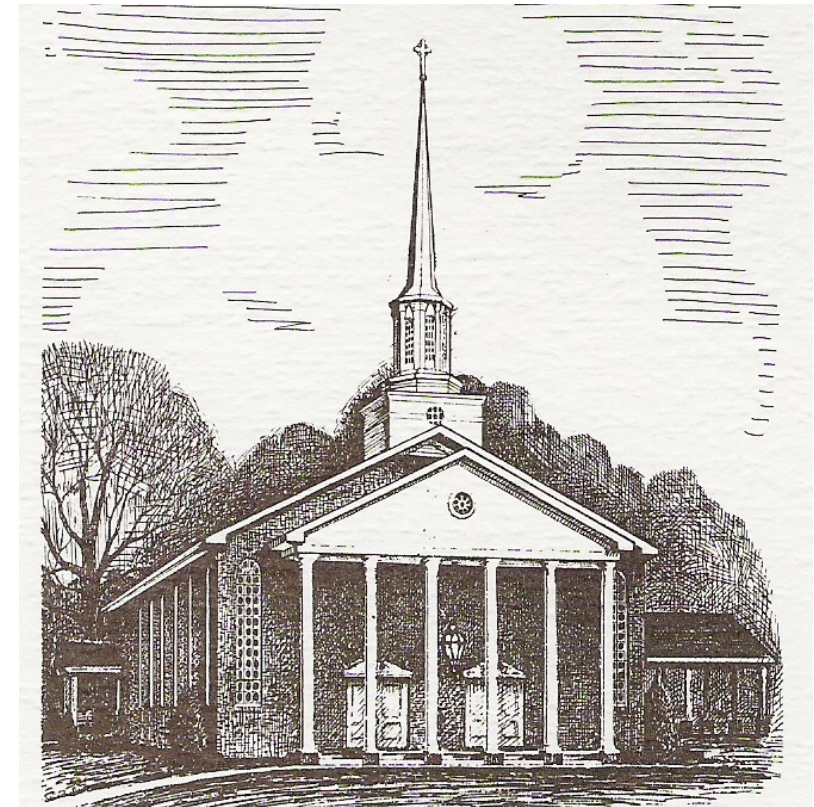

RPC OCTOBER MISSION FOCUS | The Presbyterian Hunger Grant

Goal: \$500

THE RPC PANTRY PROJECT

As some of you may or may not know, RPC member Jenna Jordan Hopper is an Area Social Work Supervisor for the Mississippi Department of Child Protection Services. She has reached out to RPC members in the past for assistance in providing food, housekeeping items, and toiletries for families and children in need. Jenna and Lynn Hill met a couple of weeks ago to discuss how RPC could be prepared to provide assistance at a moment's notice – because that's usually how much time our social workers have to take care of these families. Jenna wondered if we (RPC) could create a “pantry” designed specifically to meet these needs. After brainstorming about this, they thought perhaps we could use a former Sunday school room in our Educational Building. RPC could purchase wire shelving (like the PW purchased to store items needed for bereavement meals) and set it up in that room. Jenna came up with a specific list (see below) that could be shared with our congregation in order to stock it & she offered to take charge of keeping inventory and letting us know when items run low. She mentioned that, more often than not, she and her associates often pay for the items out of their pocket with no reimbursement. The funds are just not there. We believe this would be a wonderful opportunity to serve these children and their families, and the foster families that open their homes to these kids. Jenna is our Visionary Committee coordinator for our Outreach & Missions Ministry Team, & after sending this proposal to our session, it was wholeheartedly & enthusiastically approved. And just like that, The Pantry Project is becoming a reality!

If you want to participate, simply bring any of the items on the provided list & place them in the bins found in the narthex, OR come by the church office & drop them off with Lynn Hill.
